This course prepares and motivates students to provide leadership and assistance in learning to others in their schools and communities. Students will develop skills in communication, demonstrating initiative, teamwork, and interpersonal relationships. These skills will be applied in roles such as providing one-to-one tutoring, working with small groups of students as directed by teachers, promoting good organizational skills in classroom situations, and overall assisting teachers with organizational procedures in the classroom.

This course is designed to teach students skills in leadership and interpersonal relations. It gives them opportunity to help other students in a safe and familiar environment. They will be involved in a mentoring role with an expert teacher. Students will learn about a variety of learning issues and how to help students experiencing them. They will recognize their importance as a leader, role model, and helper. The approach to this course is one that encourages observation, interpretation, questioning, presentation, initiative and most importantly, involvement and service.
