## **Biq Ideas**

Moving images offer dynamic ways of exploring identity and culture. Moving-image artists use technology in innovative and reflective ways. Aesthetic experiences provided by moving images can effect change in artists, audiences, and environments. Technology and emerging media can transform communication in a variety of ways. History, culture, and value systems can influence film and television productions.

Film & Television 12 provides the opportunity for students to develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes they need to respond to and create video and media works. Students will plan, produce and refine moving images. Creativity will be key with an emphasis on building on strengths and interests. Mastering pre-production, production and post-production to create polished finished video media projects will be the goal of this course.

The development of projects based on interest and preplanning in collaboration with your teacher will determine your module evolution. Students are encouraged to pursue capturing their passions/interests on video. Preplanning will be key in determining the evolution of your projects. Production will hinge on the access to technology and software that you have for filming and editing. At a base level this could be an iPhone and movie. At a more enriched level this could involve a DSLR camera and industry standard software like Final Cut or Adobe Premiere.
